- 2) <u>Wealth</u> For the most part, wealthy people are happier than poor people: Are you earning an adequate salary?
- 3) <u>Intellectual Virtue</u> For the most part, educated people are happier than uneducated people: Are you continually learning new things?
- 4) <u>Moral Virtue</u> For the most part, moral people are happier than immoral people: Are you continually doing good deeds?
